
Star of the South Consultation Report

OCTOBER 2019





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Introduction

This consultation report outlines how we consulted with stakeholders and local communities on the early stages of the Star of the South project, including site investigations which are planned to commence in late 2019.

The Star of the South project was founded on a commitment to strong community and stakeholder involvement.

During August and September 2019, we ran a comprehensive program of formal consultation to:

- share information about the project and upcoming site investigations
- hear from locals about potential issues and opportunities early in the project's development.

We were particularly interested to hear suggestions or feedback from locals regarding upcoming site investigations.

We primarily sought to engage with local communities in towns near the project area, businesses, industry, local government and recreational and commercial fishers.

Consultation was undertaken through an online community engagement platform, six community information sessions, social media dialogue, emails, phone calls and stakeholder meetings.

How we promoted the consultation

The Star of the South project is in an early phase of development, so raising awareness of the project and consultation opportunities was an important part of our consultation program.

To maximise participation and raise broad project awareness and understanding, we used a range of communication and promotional activities including social media, newsletters, local newspaper and radio advertising, existing stakeholder channels and our online engagement platform Get Involved.

How we collected feedback

Community information sessions

Six community information sessions were held during September in towns across Gippsland. More than 300 locals attended the sessions to hear about the project and site investigations planned for late 2019.

Session format

Each session took place over two hours and included:


- a presentation from the team followed by an opportunity to ask questions
- access to numerous fact sheets and information displays
- almost two hours of face-to-face individual or small group discussions with project team members



• feedback via hard copy surveys, or people were directed online to have their say via the Get Involved online engagement platform.

Handouts available for attendees to take away for further reading included:

- **Project newsletter:** containing a project overview, information about site investigations and how to provide feedback.
- **Project overview:** featuring information on the project location and current status, how offshore wind works, potential benefits, information on the team and how to get in touch.
- Site investigations: including details on the exploration licence area, what will be measured and investigated at sea and on land as well as how geotechnical and geophysical investigations are conducted.
- **Planning and environmental assessment and approvals:** including details on the various assessments and approvals the project must complete and relevant regulations during the site investigations process and beyond.
- Measuring the wind and wave conditions: featuring details about investigations at sea, including floating LiDARs and their exact locations and safety information for vessels when navigating around the equipment.





Stakeholder meetings

Meetings were held with key stakeholders throughout August and September to provide an update on the project's status and next steps for the site investigations. We talked with stakeholders about the planned investigations and provided details about the typical vessels and equipment used for these studies.

These meetings also provided an opportunity to discuss and promote upcoming community information sessions or to recap what we heard from local communities through our engagement activities.

Meeting minutes and action items were captured to ensure concerns or questions could be followed up.

Online engagement platform

The Star of the South's online community engagement platform, Get Involved, experienced a high number of visits during the community engagement period in September. View the Get Involved community engagement platform at starofthesouth.com.au/getinvolved.

This platform provided an accessible one-stop-shop for project information, details of community information sessions, and a range of options for people to ask a question or provide feedback, including:

- an online survey to provide feedback about the project and upcoming site investigations
- an 'ask a question' tool allowing visitors to post a question to a notice board where the project team responded publicly. There was also an option for sending a direct enquiry to the team.


What we heard

Community members provided formal feedback through a hard copy survey at community information sessions and online at the Get Involved engagement platform. We received a total of 28 surveys – 18 from information sessions and 10 online.

The number of formal written responses provided is relatively low when compared to the total number of people we consulted with, therefore the formal feedback we received provided a snapshot of the overall discussions and sentiment towards the project and site investigations.

Generally, people attending the community information sessions were keen to find out more or meet the team rather than provide formal feedback, potentially indicating they are comfortable with the project and site investigations at this stage. Those who had strong views about the project typically contributed written feedback.

We asked participants a number of questions relating to their reasons for getting involved in the consultation process and how satisfied they were with the information available at this stage of the project. Around one quarter of respondents indicated they got involved to find out more about the project.

We also asked questions to understand how people felt about the upcoming site investigations and if they perceived any issues or had concerns. We took the opportunity to find out what people value about the local area and what they think is important for the team to consider as we progress the project.

Here's a snapshot of key topics of interest and sentiment captured through surveys:



Community feedback and key themes

Survey responses provided valuable insights into the community's hopes and concerns for the project.

We consistently heard that creating new opportunities for industry and the provision of local jobs are high priorities for people in the region, with many noting this should be achieved across the project lifespan, including site investigations.

We also heard that the region's environmental assets, such as its coastline, underwater habitat and various flora and fauna are highly valued by locals. Some concerns were raised about the potential environmental impact of the site investigations including from the geotechnical surveys, as well as impacts on the marine ecosystem and migrating birds.

Fishing was another top theme discussed during this consultation, with recreational and commercial fishers noting they were interested to know how the project would manage potential exclusion zones during construction and operation.

Lastly, it was evident that a number of people who provided feedback were eager to see the project succeed and lead the way for other projects of its kind in Australia. We received an overwhelming amount of support from locals who are excited at the opportunities the project could bring, as well as suggestions on how to continue engaging with the community as we progress planning to ensure any impacts are appropriately managed.



Local jobs and industry are the top priority

We heard from respondents that the project's potential benefits for direct local employment and economic benefits for local supply chains is very important. The community hopes to see locally-based jobs with local industry and services making up a supply chain.

"Offset lost job opportunities as Gippsland closes coal power generation" - Online survey

This feedback included suggestions for the site investigations phase which respondents feel could be supported by procuring local vessels to undertake this work where possible.

"Local jobs during all stages going forward. Be it repurposed fishing vessels for patron work during surveys or local trades for maintenance."

In addition, respondents hope the project could build local skills through training programs across the offshore wind supply chain. Currently, respondents are concerned that the decline in local industry is leading to limited opportunities for young people in the Gippsland region.

Protecting the region's environmental assets

A common theme across the consultation was the value of the region's environmental beauty and coastline. Responses indicate that the region's beauty is a major drawcard for tourism and provides lifestyle benefits for the local community.

Those who did have concerns about the project and site investigations highlighted that protecting the environment throughout the project planning and development process would be critical. In particular, ensuring that marine ecosystems and migratory birds are safeguarded during site investigations. Some feedback about the construction and operation of the wind farm was also received, including the potential distance of the turbines from the shore and visibility.

Ensuring recreational and commercial fishing is appropriately protected

Some respondents indicated that recreational fishing is important to the local community as a popular pastime and tourism drawcard for the area. Most comments regarding fishing were focused on potential exclusion zones for fishers and highlighted the need to work closely with these groups. Whilst commercial fishing did not feature heavily in written feedback, it was noted that working with this industry as the project progresses would be important.

Some respondents noted that the project may have a number of benefits for local fish populations through the creation of artificial reefs on the turbine structures. Some respondents felt this new habitat for fish populations would have additional benefits for fishers, particularly for recreational fishing.

Managing community impacts

Whilst the project is still at a very early stage of development, we heard from respondents that it is important to ensure local changes and impacts during the project's lifespan are effectively communicated. People want to be made aware of project activities and developments and how they might impact on the local area before they happen. Providing opportunities for the community to get involved and have their say on how these changes could be effectively managed to reduce impacts would be crucial for delivering the best possible outcomes.

Setting the project up for success

Respondents indicated that they are excited about the project's bold vision and there is a hope that the Star of the South's success would pave the way for future projects.

"Run a successful project that may promote further Australian projects"

Several respondents believe that the project would provide clean, reliable power that benefits the environment. This level of support was reflected when respondents were asked to indicate what they believed to be the biggest issue the project faces. We heard concerns that potential community opposition could impact the project's success.

Local jobs and industry are a top priority	We will continue to work with local people, businesses and the education and training sectors to discuss opportunities, identify local skills and capabilities and understand any barriers to employment or contracting. This will include working with the local supply chain early to develop needs, accreditation and requirements. Businesses are able to register their interest in the project via our website, and we have responded to these enquiries with a promise to keep in touch as our investigations continue.

Protecting the region's environmental assets	There are laws in Australia that strictly govern the type of investigations we are planning, and we are complying with requirements and controls, to minimise the potential for any impacts.
C'or ma	We have environmental specialists on board who are conducting full assessments of any potential impacts as a result of our activities. These assessments have found the potential impacts to be low. We are sharing the details of our assessments with government regulators to ensure a thorough independent review and we will comply with any further directions or obligations as part of this process.
	Our contractors are also required to prepare environmental plans to ensure the investigations are carried out responsibly.

Issue	Our response
Protecting the region's environmental assets continued	Visibility The closest boundary of the exploration licence from the coast is around 10 kilometres. So while we are still confirming the feasibility of the project, should it proceed to construction and operation, we know the boundaries it may be in and that offshore wind farms are typically seen from land. We will be doing studies into what people could expect to see from the coast and we will develop some visuals and artist impressions of the wind farm as part of those studies to share with people. We do not expect the site investigations to have a visual impact on the coast line.
Ensuring recreational and commercial fishing is appropriately protected	We have consulted with the Australian Maritime Safety Authority, marine shipping, marine tourism and fishing (recreational, commercial and Indigenous) communities regarding our planned investigations to ensure equipment is placed in a safe and navigable location. The planned locations of fixed equipment such as acoustic equipment and floating LiDARs will also be made known to all marine users through the Notice to Mariners (issued via the Australian Hydrographic Office), Transport Safety Victoria and other relevant organisations. Additionally, information on the locations of sea-based equipment was provided during the September consultation period to recreational and commercial fishers, as well as to other key marine stakeholders. This information was provided via a factsheet and also included instructions on what to do in the event of entanglement, damage or an emergency. We will ensure equipment such as floating LiDAR devices are appropriately lit and uniquely identified when launched offshore. While we don't expect any major impacts during our activities, we will advise fishers and other marine users to keep a sensible and safe distance from our equipment and operations. We have set up a dedicated phone number so fishers can continue to contact us with any concerns on 1800 340 340, should any impacts arise. We acknowledge the legislated rights of commercial fishers and we also recognise that recreational fishing is hugely important to locals and visitors to Gippsland. We are open and committed to working with fishers on the potential benefits that could be created by an offshore wind farm as well as understanding how we can best co-exist and collaborate into the future.
Managing community impacts	 We recognise that the Star of the South project will mean some physical changes to the local environment if it proceeds to construction and operation. We are currently in the feasibility phase, with site investigations to confirm how the project could be designed. We will share information about our planning and design work and will investigate (together with local people) opportunities to minimise potential community impacts as a result of the project, should it proceed to construction and operation. 


